Wright, Messer, Named to Team of the Week

For their efforts in leading Portland Hearts of Pine to a 1-0 win against Texoma FC on September 27, Ollie Wright and Nathan Messer have been named to the USL League One Team of the Week for Week 30, the league announced on Tuesday.

The honor is Wright's eighth league honor of the year, and Messer's fourth.

In the 75th minute of the match, Titus Washington fed the ball centrally to Natty James at the edge of the Texoma penalty area; James then completed the crossfield switch by finding Wright wide on the left. Wright held right back Will Perkins in position, letting Messer run past the defender, then fed the ball through to the Hearts fullback as he sprinted into the penalty area. Messer's one-time shot flew past Texoma goalkeeper Javier Garcia into the back of the net, and orange smoke—a new addition to celebrate Portland's new Blaze kit—billowed from the Dirigo Union section of the stands.

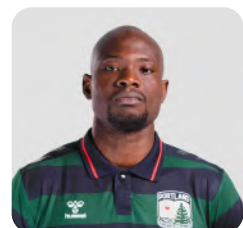

Defender | Bamako, Mali

Previous Club: Los Angeles Galaxy (MLS)

French central defender Séga Coulibaly made 49 starts for Los Angeles Galaxy between 2021 and 2023, including playing the full 90 minutes in both of Los Angeles' 2022 playoff matches. During his three seasons with the Major League Soccer club he played a key role in shutout wins over Real Salt Lake, Minnesota United, Houston Dynamo, New York City FC, Charlotte FC, Chicago Fire, Nashville SC, Austin FC, CF Montréal, and Atlanta United. In 2022, he also scored the match-winning goal in a 2-1 "El Tráfico" win over Los Angeles FC. Born in Mali, Coulibaly moved to France at age six and made 20 appearances with France's U16 through U20 sides. He signed with French club Rennes II as a 16-year-old, and went on to make 143 appearances in France with Rennes II, Sedan, Avranches, Nancy, and Rennes before signing with the LA Galaxy in 2021.

Born and raised in Jamaica, Kemali was introduced to soccer at a young age in a community where the sport was deeply ingrained in everyday life. Representing his country at the youth level, he refined his skills with local teams before moving to the United States. There, he joined the Philadelphia Union Academy, laying the foundation for his collegiate success and set the stage for his transition to the professional game—a dream that has driven him since his earliest days in the sport.

Khalid Hersi is officially the first-ever Mainer to sign with Hearts of Pine after winning the MVP award at the Hearts Open Combine in December. A native of Lewiston, Khalid grew up in a soccer-loving Somali family and played at Lewiston High School, where in 2019, he played in the state final as a freshman alongside his older brother Bilal.

In 2023, Hersi joined the University of Southern Maine's men's soccer team. As a freshman midfielder, he played in 15 games. More recently, Hersi played for Wahda United FC in the United Premier Soccer League (UPSL), and his performances earned him a place on the UPSL Team of the Season.

Midfielder | Trinidad & Tobago

Previous Club: Mount Pleasant (Jamaica)

Born and raised in Trinidad & Tobago, Nathaniel 'Natty' James' football journey began at the age of five when his father, a guiding influence in his career, introduced him to the game. He first gained national attention during the 2022 Concacaf Under-20 Championship, where he scored four goals and provided three assists, helping Trinidad and Tobago reach the round of 16. His performances at the youth level led to his senior international debut in a friendly against Jamaica in March 2023. In the inaugural Trinidad & Tobago Premier Football League (TTPFL) season in 2023, James emerged with 15 goals, playing a pivotal role in Club Sando's third-place finish. His domestic success earned him a move to Jamaica's Mount Pleasant Football Academy in September 2023. On the international stage James scored the winning goal in Trinidad & Tobago's 1-0 victory over Curaçao in a Concacaf Nations League match that same month.

Alex Ryan brings a wealth of experience, regional knowledge and a proven track record of success to his role as assistant coach for Hearts of Pine. Originally from Newcastle, England, Alex began his early soccer journey with the Sunderland Youth Academy before playing professionally in the fourth National League at Gateshead FC. Alex earned a college scholarship to Campbellsville University in Kentucky, where he served as team captain. While at Campbellsville, he played a key role in the team winning a conference championship and was recognized with 1st Team All-Conference honors.

Alex's connection to the United States soccer scene was further solidified during his time playing for the Premier Development League (PDL) with Seacoast United. It was here that he first established ties to the club, and transitioned from player into his first coaching position. He served as the MLS Next Academy Director, and in 2016, Alex took on the role of Seacoast United's NPSL Head Coach in USL League Two, where he achieved unparalleled success. Under his leadership, the team became the 2024 USL 2 National Champions and maintained an impressive all-time 82% winning percentage with an overall record of 53-9-6. Seacoast United also secured Northeast Division titles in 2022, 2023, and 2024, set a record points total for the division, and reached the playoffs four years in a row, culminating in an Eastern Conference title in 2024.

Alex's coaching accomplishments extend beyond team success. He has helped develop more than 40 professional players, including two top-5 MLS draft picks.

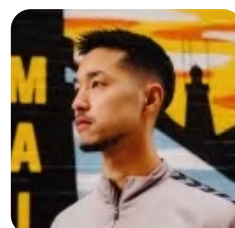

GOALKEEPER COACH YUTA NOMURA



Yuta Nomura joins Portland Hearts of Pine from New England Revolution II, where he spent five seasons as second-team goalkeeper. Collegiately, Yuta played for Lindsey Wilson College in Columbia, Kentucky. As a freshman in 2011, he started all 23 games, leading the Blue Raiders to an NAIA National Championship and an undefeated 23-0-0 season. Over his four-year career, he recorded a 68-11-3 record with 35 clean sheets and set personal bests in his freshman season for save percentage (.838), shutouts (14), and saves (62). Lindsey Wilson finished third in the NAIA Tournament during his sophomore and junior years.

Yuta spent two-and-a-half seasons in Sweden with BK Olympic, competing in Division 2 Västra Götaland. He also played two seasons in the PDL (now USL League Two), representing the Springfield Demize in 2014 and the Michigan Bucks in 2015.

Early in Yuta's career, he served as part of the coaching staff at the University of Central Arkansas (NCAA Division I) for two seasons. His efforts contributed to the staff winning the Missouri Valley Conference Coaching Staff of the Year award in 2018, a season in which UCA claimed the conference title and earned a berth in the NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament. After transitioning to the Sun Belt Conference in 2019, Yuta helped guide the Bears to a regular-season title with a 10-7-1 overall record and a 4-1 conference mark.

Yuta spent five seasons with New England Revolution II, where he coached second-team goalkeepers and assisted first-team goalkeepers. During this time, he worked alongside Kevin Hitchcock, as well as goalkeepers Matt Turner, Djordje Petrović, and Aljaž Ivačič. Since 2022, he also took on responsibilities for set-piece coaching.
